

"Looking Ahead Together" Conference Annual meeting with the Cree Nation

Val-d'Or, April 25, 2017 – The team at the Secretariat to the Cree Nation Abitibi-Témiscamingue Economic Alliance (SCNATEA) has unveiled the program for the 13th edition of the conference "Looking Ahead Together", to be held in Mistissini June 6 and 7.

This conference aims at strengthening partnerships, business dialogue and cultural awareness between Abitibi-Témiscamingue, Eeyou Istchee James Bay and Nunavik.

Participants will have the opportunity to hear from more than twenty speakers. The event will open with a presentation by start-up and venture capital expert, Dr. Sean Wise. Other speakers will include Jimmy Jean, CFA, Senior Economist and Economic Strategist at Desjardins, Ghislain Poirier, Vice President, Public Affairs at Stornoway Diamond Corporation, and Jean-Luc Bugnon, strategic coordinator - infrastructures and environment at Société du Plan Nord. Simultaneous translation of presentations will be available on site.

The event will also feature discussion panels on promoting Aboriginal tourism, mineral development in Northern Quebec, and economic development.

The conference is organized in collaboration with the Cree Nation of Mistissini and the Grand Council of the Crees (Eeyou Istchee).
