Registration is now open for the Interregional Economic Circle of Indigenous Peoples. The event will take place on November 14 and 15 at the Forestel Hotel in Val-d'Or. It will be followed, on November 16th, by a special edition of Business Exchange Day.

This event aims, like the First Nations of Quebec and Labrador Great Economic Circle, to create a movement in Quebec towards a better inclusion of Indigenous Peoples in the economy.

Here is an overview of the program.

Circle 1: How do today's Indigenous leaders see the future and what roles will they and their successors have to play to remain or become agents of change for their Nations as well as for Quebec society?

Circle 2: Can municipalities and Indigenous communities become allies in economic development projects on their territories? Where should they start?

Circle 3: What approaches should be adopted to enable Indigenous communities to increase their autonomy and improve their ability to determine their own future?
