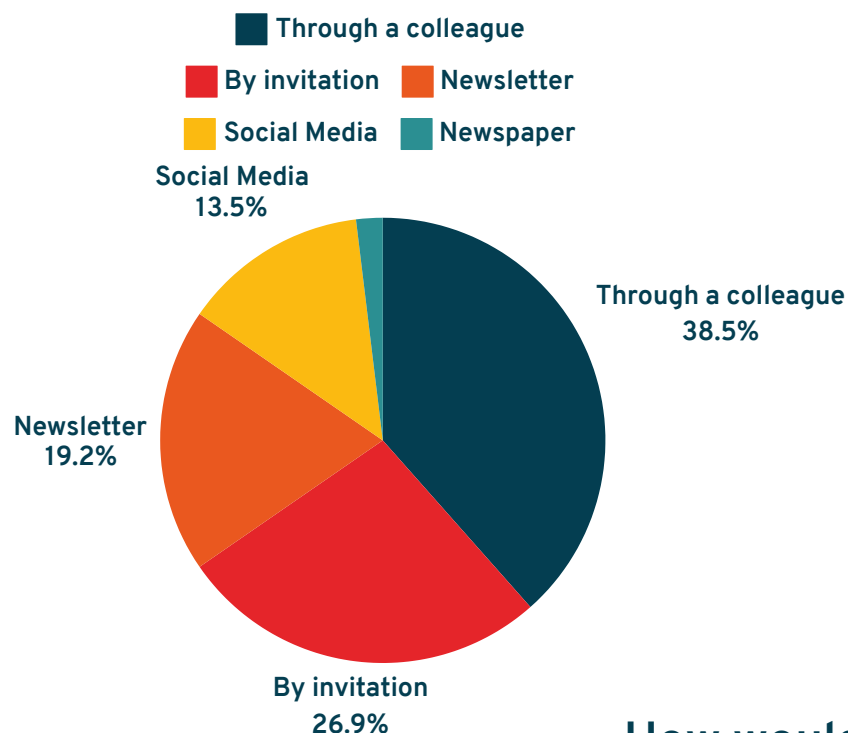

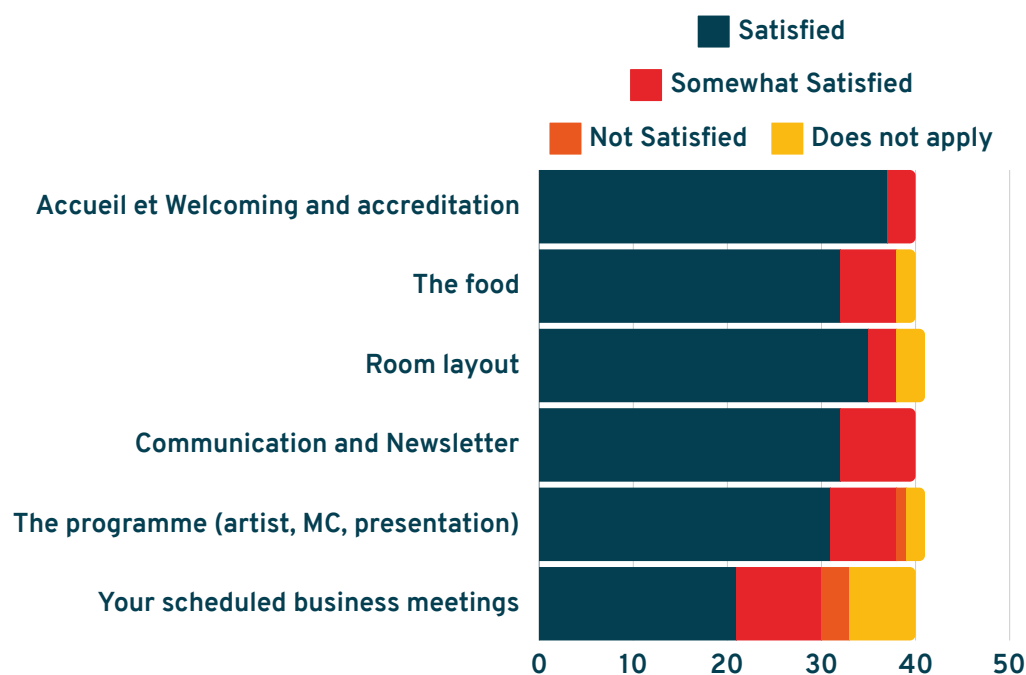
## How did you hear about the event?

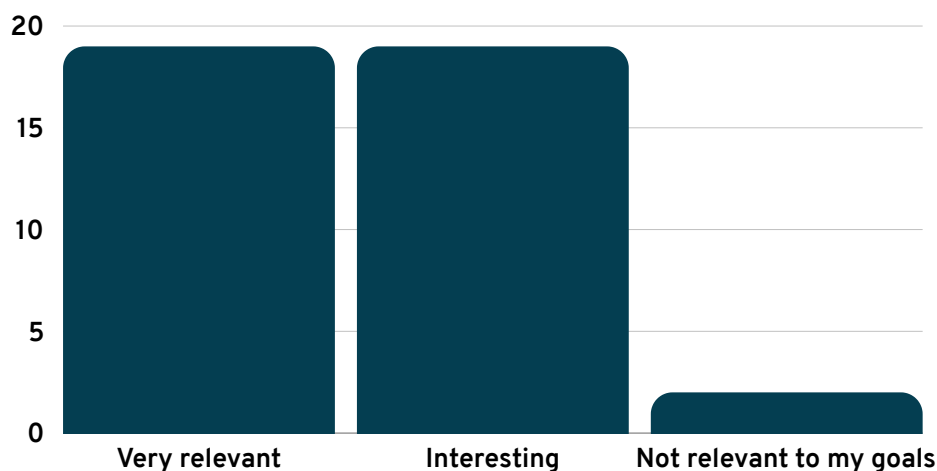

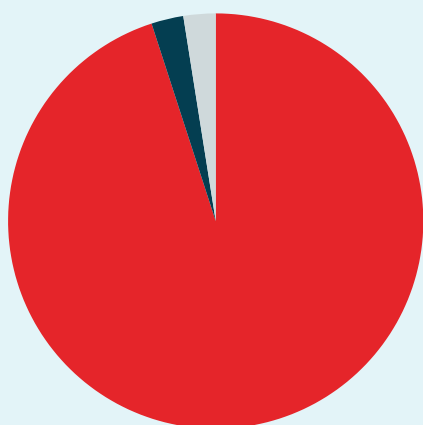


How would you evaluate the potential impact of the meetings at the Business Exchange Day, present or past, on your business?



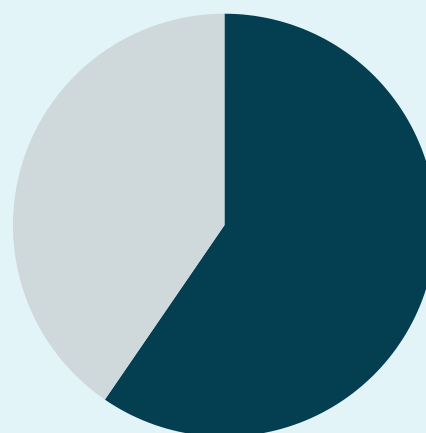

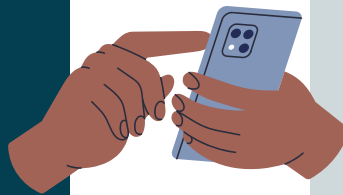

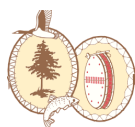
